Cultural Week: Embracing Diversity and Celebrating Heritage



DUKE OF EDINGBURGH AWARD.

We had a brilliant trip to STEAM Northants at University of Northampton. The STEAM festival celebrated all things science, technology, engineering, arts and maths. CAR CRASH CAREERS

The Car Crash Careers event gave students an insight into studying a wide range of subjects at university and the reality of the day-to-day experience of each career. The aim was to get the students to get an in depth look at career options on offer that they might not be aware of and to challenger the perceptions they might hold about these professions.

During the day, students got to witness the immediate after-effects of a stimulated car crash. Including a live demonstration of the fire service cutting a car door off in a simulated emergency. The students got to look at the various role's professions play in giving a wide range of care and support after the crash.





We have been working hard to secure as many external organisations to come along and support our students at our careers fair this year. The careers fair will be open to year 9, 10, and 12.
