This term we have increased our focus on interactions, behaviours and conversations with each other, and our commitment to challenge any behaviour that impacts the wellbeing or safety of others. We are focusing our **CALL IT OUT** campaign on building students' confidence in challenging comments, behaviours or actions that are inappropriate, disrespectful, or not accepting of the characteristics that make our diverse community so special. I will only be satisfied that we have made progress on this when our students are confident to call out situations amongst their own peer groups- this is the marker of a truly inclusive and accepting that students can access, and students are having weekly assemblies/Teams sessions related to key priorities by myself, or Mrs Schofield, our Designated Safeguarding Lead.

It has been great to get to see so many faces at the first few Principal Drop ins, which have given us an opportunity to discuss parent concerns, hear about the improvement direction of the school, and to offer you some free refreshments!

We have this week held reward parties for tutor groups with the highest attendance, and our new Education Welfare officer, Tracey Coare, has joined us to increase our systems around attendance. You have fed back that this is an area of communication that can be improved, and we are working hard to action these items.

Year 11 have had a taster day for 6th form which allowed them to experience some A level subjects, and we have seen some exciting developments in our Football Academy and Performing Arts Academy that will begin for 6th formers in Septemberplease pass on to any budding performers or footballers who may not attend Abbeyfield- we're in it to win it!

There are some important upcoming dates for you all to remember such as Year 9 Options evening, Legally Blonde and the start of year 11 revision and intervention program. We have a college competition this week that has been informed by student feedback, and we'll hopefully see a FIFA champion crowned very shortly!



CAREER NEWS: TIME TO CELEBRATE

We have some fantastic news to share with you. Before Christmas we informed you about a number of our students who had applied for the role of STEAM Youth Director. This is for a new nationwide initiative being led by the STEAM Project. Five students were interviewed face-to-face in December and we have just been informed that four out of five have been successful in achieving this role.

They received over 110 applications which were shortlisted to 48. They interviewed 45 young people online and face to face over 5 days in November and December. Representatives from the STEAM Project commented that every single one of them showed up and did amazingly. It was extremely hard to select the final twenty.

We are extremely proud of these students who took the initiative and applied for this role. The fact that there were only 20 places across the whole of the UK and we have 4 students who have been selected is just amazing.

We are looking forward to watching how these students develop over the coming months and the opportunities that they will be given.

FOOTBALL.


