Drop-ins

Every week we hold dropin sessions with the Principal, Head of Year and select members of the senior leadership team. Details of these sessions are regularly communicated to parents/guardians, we encourage you to attend if you wish to speak to a member of staff about any issues or concerns.

Communication

Appearance and Standards

At Abbeyfield School, we set clear expectations to our students in respect of their appearance. These are listed below:

- Hair colour must be of a natural colour and shaved patterns in hair are not permitted.
- False eyelashes are not allowed.
- A modest amount if makeup is permitted however, it should be natural.
- Hoodies are not permitted in school under any circumstances. Students should bring a coat on colder days.
- Jewellery is limited to 1 pair of earrings studs, no hoops. And 1 watch.
- Facial piercings are not permitted. Piercings will be confiscated and passed to the Head of Year.
- No denim jackets.
- Chewing gum is not permitted.

Uniform

PE Kit

All students are required to wear uniform for PE lessons. An outline of the uniform requirements is listed below:



All students are advised in their first PE lesson that they are to bring kit to PE even if they are excused from participating practically. The reason for this is that we would like 'excused' students to take on the role of an official or a coach. (The only exception is if they have a broken bone.)

Equipment_

Students need to bring the necessary equipment to each lesson. The following is required:

Pupil Premium

Students from specific backgrounds are proven to underachieve academically when compared to their non-disadvantaged peers nationally. The pupil premium is additional funding to support these pupils to succeed at school.

The objectives of Pupil Premium are:

To diminish any gaps in attainment and progress outcomes between those students from disadvantaged backgrounds against national for non-disadvantaged by the end of Key Stage 4 (Year 11).

To increase attainment and progress outcomes by disadvantaged students in English and Mathematics.

Reduce absence, lateness to school, exclusions and improve attitude to learning.

Ensure that there is equality of opportunity for all leavers through access to high quality curriculum, academic pathways, Post 16 destinations and enrichment opportunities.

Disadvantaged criteria are:

Pupils who have registered for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years.

Pupils who are looked after by the local authority for more than six months.

Pupils whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

Free School Meals_

Some students are eligible to Free School Meals. For those who are, a daily free school meal allowance is uploaded to the student fingerprint accounts to allow them to purchase their lunch.

If you are in receipt of any of the following, you may be eligible for free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income based jobseekers Allowance
- Income related employment and Support allowance
- Support under part IV of the immigrant and asylum act 1999
- Child tax credit, with no element of working tax credit, and household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Universal tax credit

ParentPay

We are now a cashless school. This means that each parent is provided with an account for ParentPay to enable you to pay for school lunches, trips etc.

Parents can log in to their ParentPay accounts to top up lunch accounts for students as often as they would like to. You will also be able to view the amount that your child has spent in the school refectory each day. This system operations with students' fingerprints being used as the payment method, with the amount spent taking automatically from your parent pay account.

Each parent will be provided with an allocated username and password, we will send home a letter with your child on one of the Transition days.

If you already have a ParentPay account, you can continue to use it by logging in, select add child, enter the code on your letter (these are given in September), followed by submit.

Getting to School

The main route is a footpath which takes students along the side of a busy carriageway and under an underpass. We suggest that students walk together in groups for safety. Any poor behavior reported for students walking either to or from school, will be dealt with according to our policies.

On Foot

Many of our students live locally and so the easiest way to get into school is on foot. Please make sure that your child is safety aware if you are intending for them to walk to school.

Bicycle

Many of our students cycle to school. There is a public right of way across the field adjacent to the school but there is no CCTV along this point. If your child wishes to ride their bicycle to school, this is at their own risk. Students must ensure that they lock their bicycles to the designated racks as securely as possible. Bicycles are not to be ridden around the school grounds.

Car

Your child can be dropped off within the school car park, however, please move along once they are deposited. The layby outside of the school is not to be used for parking as this obstructs other drivers, particularly Lorries and emergency vehicles. Please be aware of pedestrians in all areas of the school grounds crossing roads and paths.

Bus

A small minority of students use the bus service. The bus does not stop directly at Abbeyfield and therefore you should plan your own route to arrive at the nearest bus stop to Abbeyfield that is covered by your service.

Attendance

What to do if your child is absent

We would ask you please to contact the school on each day of absence at 8am on **01604 826146** leaving their name, tutor group and reason for absence, or you may opt to inform us via the Arbor app. If the absence is more than 4 days long, you will need to provide a note from the GP.

If your child is absent and we have not been informed of the reason for this, we will notify you via text. You can respond to this message and give us accurate details and the reason for the absence.

Authorised absence

- Genuine illness
- A family crisis (i.e. bereavement)
- Religious observance if notified in advance

Unauthorised absence

- Shopping
- Oversleeping
- Celebrating a birthday
- Term time holidays

Please note: Unauthorised absences may result in a referral to Education and Inclusion Partnership depending upon the situation.

Absence 90% and under

If your child's attendance reaches 90% or below, interventions will be introduced to encourage your child to attend school on a regular basis.

These may be:

- Head of Year contact
- Mentoring
- Home Visits
- Attendance support meetings/ parenting contract/referral to EIP

The Role of Form Time

The role as a Personal Development (PD) Form Tutor is an important one. PD Tutors are often the first member of staff your child/children meet when they arrive in the mornings. PD tutors will greet the students in the morning line ups and get their day off to a good start; they are also the first point of contact for parents.

What your child should expect:

- Daily form line ups with tutors.
- Quality form tutor sessions to promote a positive routine driven start to the day.
- Sharing of the Principals' weekly bulletin on Mondays to communicate important information.
- Form notices boards will include updates, to remind students of key notices and dates.
- Distribution of appointments/detention information, to allow students to access the support offered within school.
- Target setting on attendance and punctuality where needed to monitor and support attendance, academic or personal targets.
- Equipment checks to ensure students are organised in order to access learning.
- High quality assemblies delivered to promote year group and whole school ethos ensuring students.
- Celebration of success and achievement via awards assembly and Principals' commendations.
- Supporting charities to promote whole school ethos.

Tracking Progress

In readiness for your child starting at Abbeyfield School, we have liaised with your child's primary school to help give us an idea of each student's level of achievement.

We continue to monitor and track progress of each student throughout their journey with us.

Regular assessment

In Key Stage 3 Summative assessments take place twice a year in all year groups, across all subjects. They aim to match the rigour of external national assessments. These examinations indicate students' progress and attainment in each subject. These Trust wide assessments are cumulative, meaning they assess the powerful knowledge taught in previous units of work as well as content recently taught. The results from these assessments are reported home in Grade Cards along with whether students are on track to achieve their targets.

Regular reporting

Students receive a grade card twice a year. This shows the progress and attitude they have adopted to learning. Each year a report is written which identifies the strengths and weaknesses in each subject.

Parent's consultation evenings

Parents are given the opportunity to attend a consultation meeting to discuss their child's progress. These consultation evenings are held once a year. Parents are able to book their appointments for this evening online via Schoolcloud.

Incentives

- Weekly rewards
- Half termly prize draw for students who have received 100% attendance.

Praise and Rewards_

Rewards and incentives play a central role in our belief that students should be recognised for the elements of their effort that go above normal expectations. On the whole, schools can fall into the trap of rewards being a tokenistic gesture, but we believe that rewards carry greater impact when they are informed by student voice, as well as being more tangible across a regular period of time.

We aim to get a meaningful balance between positive and negative reinforcement, and we ask that all parents support our systems to ensure that those who get it right are rightly rewarded.

All parents and students will have access to ePraise where you will be able to monitor and review the number of Praise and Consequence points allocated on a day-to-day basis. Praise points can be used towards rewards of student choice as well as key incentives and opportunities as outlined on our Praise Pyramid.

In addition, Golden Tickets are distributed daily throughout for students who are consistently doing the right thing or going above and beyond. These tickets then take place in a prize draw at the end of each half term, where prizes include iPads, Air pods and Amazon vouchers. Students with excellent attendance also receive weekly Praise Points, a 'jump the queue' refectory pass and a draw for weekly Amazon vouchers. GOLDEN TICKET

We also have our brand-new Rewards Room, 'The Retreat', opening in September 2023 where students have access to games consoles, music and refreshments

Our Policies

Homework

We strongly believe that homework not only develops students' independent learning skills but also gives them the opportunity to prepare for, extend and consolidate learning away from the classroom. Therefore, we refer to homework as **Extended Learning**. When planning Extended Learning, teachers always consider the following questions (not all will apply for every piece set):

- Does the work recap, consolidate, reinforce and extend the skills and knowledge developed in the classroom?
- Does the work offer opportunities for flipped learning, perhaps ensuring that students come prepared and therefore teachers can start 'on the hard part' earlier in the lesson?
- Does the work encourage students to develop the skills needed for independent learning, including self-discipline and working to deadlines?

A variety of tasks will be set for Extended Learning which are designed to encourage students to explore a range of independent learning styles and resources. Wherever possible, Extended Learning will be digital in nature.

Mobile Phones

We are a No Mobile Phone school. In order to promote effective learning during lessons and safeguard our students, we do not permit the use of the following items on site during school hours:

- Mobile phones
- Personal music devices inc headphones etc
- Smart watches
- Any other electronic device

Any such items should remain switched off and in pupils' bags only. Any devices seen or heard will be confiscated. Confiscated items are handed to the Principal, and are to be collected at the end of the day from Reception.

Confiscation of such items will in most cases result in a C2 break time detention being issued. However, if repeated use is noted, this then may result in a C3 after school detention, or the pupil being required to hand in their device every morning on standards gate for a week. If a pupil refuses to hand over their device to a member of staff, this will be dealt with in line with the behaviour policy.

If there is an emergency, parents need to contact Reception who will then deal with any parent-child required communication.

Social Media

Social media usage is not allowed at any point in the school grounds. Safe and appropriate use of such sites is taught as part of the curriculum.

If you have any concerns regarding your child's usage of social media, please contact the Head of Year. Cyber bullying will not be tolerated and will be dealt with according to our school policies.

Advice to pupils:

- Use safe passwords
- Use sites that are appropriate for age
- Do not meet any online friends without parental consent/supervision
- Know how to block unwanted sites and communications
