Attendance Expectation Reminders	 Try to contact the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence. Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters. If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival. Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend. If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance, then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

	 Check your child's attendance every day. Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you. Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned. If we cannot establish a reason for absence or your child has been absent for 3 days+, then we may make a welfare home visit.
